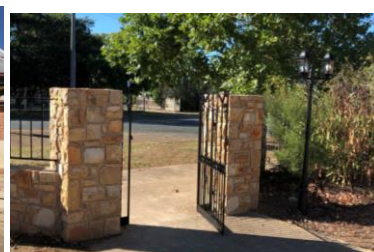


Regional Swimming Sports

Gr F-1WV – Lacie W – For learning our school routines and following them with a great attitude. Great stuff Lacie!

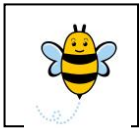
Gr 1-2FF – Desmond C – Des has been the best learner he can be by learning how to use his Ipad to read his readers out loud. Well done Des!

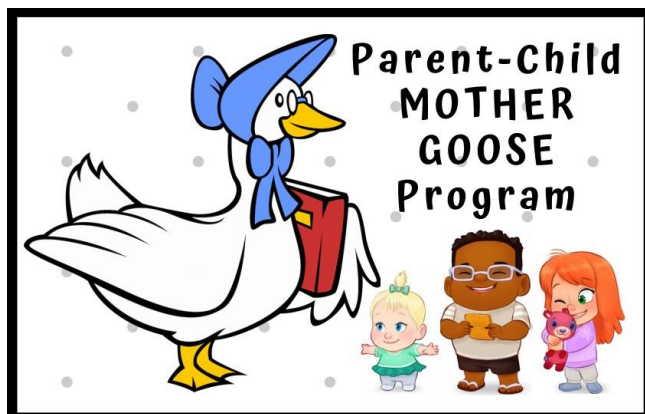


Chaplains News:
