#### Solar Panels

Over the holidays we have had solar panels installed at the school with us being connected to the grid this week. School Council investigated and approved this project, and it is anticipated that the cost of the panels will be recovered in savings from our power bills in 5-6 years.

#### **Covid Information**

Thanks to all for their continued testing and monitoring of student's health. With us having several positive cases this week I would like to remind parents of the following guidelines.

#### **Facemasks**

While recommended, face masks are not required in any school settings. Any students or staff members who wish to wear a mask may do so, including those who are medically at-risk

#### What to do if your child tests positive

Please notify the school and report the result to the Department of Health online, or call 1800 675 398. A student who tests positive to COVID-19, either through RA test or PCR test is required to isolate for a minimum of 7 days. They can return to school after 7 days if free from symptoms.

#### **Household Contacts**

Household contacts are no longer required to quarantine as long as they take additional safety measures, but are **required** to:

- notify the school if returning during their 7 day period;
- undertake daily rapid antigen testing five times within the 7 days;
- wear a face covering when indoors if aged 8 years and above

If **symptomatic**, all students must stay/return home, take a rapid antigen test, or get a PCR test.

#### **Professional Practice Day**

Students will not be required at school on **Tuesday 24<sup>th</sup> May.** All staff will be working on moderating assessments and report writing on this day.
