Gr 5-6BC – Aleisha A – For being a learner and working hard to learn about punctuation. Noticing it in books and using it in your writing. Well done!


Gr 5-6BC – Charlotte S– For being a learner when producing a writing sample that oozes voice, considers audiences and is very creative and different.


