
If you are unable to attend orders can be placed at the office and payment can be made by cash, eftpos, or online or pop into the library and browse for yourself!

Chappy's News

Hi all, I have heard it said that we truly don't know or understand what someone is going through until we experience it ourselves. This is how I felt when I saw the destruction and devastation of the caravan park. I heard about the high water but seeing it as I was driving past was way more confronting when I saw it myself. It is true that I did not experience this and have had a range of emotions when we were isolated but dry of flood waters. The many Phone calls of "are you ok, heard about the flood" from Melbourne, Adelaide, Queensland and even America. One friend rang urgently as he knew we lived near a golf course. He said, 'the Golf Course is underwater, you ok? 'It is not our Golf Course I explained' It was hard to say we were ok and dry while knowing for many this was not the case. Nor did I have any understanding of what it is like to be in flood waters, have your home and property damaged and loose family items. If you have experienced this my heart goes out to you. I remember seeing the news where our students were helping out, filling sandbags to support the community. I was very proud of them. As a result, I have asked Mrs Goodwin if I can put on a "I Am Proud of You" Pancake morning with mix ins for all students on December 6. There will be no cost as this is our way of saying thank you and we are proud of you. Chappy

Current Situation

- Goulburn Valley Water is aware of an issue in Lenne St, Mooroopna.
 Toolamba rd is temporarily closed to allow for water pumping. (portable toilets are available at Stanley street & 73 hall street.)
 Pumping operations in Mooroopna are expected to be completed in the next three days
- In the Goulburn-Broken Catchment, more than 1,600 properties have been assessed and around 800 of those properties have been impacted by flooding
- Emergency agency crews continue to assist residents with relocations, flooding impacts, pumping water as well community welfare checks and information
- More rain is forecast for today and emergency services are urging the community to remain informed.
- Flood waters are continuing to stay high within Barmah and lower Moira Communities
- Many trees are falling due to the wet ground.
 Never park your vehicle or shelter under trees during storms.

Current warnings

- Major flooding is occurring at Echuca, Moama, Torrumbarry and Barham.
- Moderate Flood Warning for the Goulburn River


