





## Flood Financial Support

The Department of Education and Training is offering support to Victorian government school students who are affected by the floods. Families whose home and/or belongings have been damaged by the floods can access assistance for each school student in their household to replace essential school items. Support to replace items of up to the value of \$1,200 is available for each student who has been impacted by:

- Loss or damage to home; and/or
- Loss or damage to contents/belongings (this may include impact from the power being off and impact of isolation)

## **How To Apply**

Please contact the Department of Education and Training hotline on 1800 338 663 to register your request for assistance. The hotline is open from 8.30am to 6.00pm weekdays.


As part of the request process, during the call you will be asked to provide the following information:

- Family name
- Family contact details e.g. address, phone, email
- Impact e.g. loss or damage to home, contents/belongings
- Victorian government school name(s)
- Number of school-aged students in your household

Hotline staff will forward your request details to State Schools' Relief who will arrange for the support to be provided to you via the school.

#### GREATER SHEPPARTON

The Greater Shepparton Australia Day Committee is calling on individuals, groups and organisations to nominate a resident of Greater Shepparton who has made a **noteworthy** contribution during the current year, given **outstanding** service to the local community and/or impacted on the local community over a number of years.

#### ELIGIBILITY:

- Nominees must be Australian Citizens
- Nominees must be residents of the Greater Shepparton municipality
- · Self nominations will not be accepted
- Nominees for Greater Shepparton Young Citizen of the Year must be aged under 30 years of age on 26 January 2023
- Nominees for Greater Shepparton Senior Citizen of the Year must be aged 65 years or over of age on 26 January 2023
- Unsuccessful nominees may be renominated in subsequent years
- Nominees are only eligible for nomination in their area of residence. These areas include, Shepparton, Mooroopna & District, Tatura & District, Murchison, Toolamba, Arcadia and Dookie. Check you are completing the correct form. (Further clarification of these areas is listed on page 4)
- Community groups within Greater Shepparton will be eligible for consideration under 'Community Event of the Year'
- Community Event of the Year can include virtual events
